






### ENRIITC objectives and concept



#### **CONSOLIDATION OF THE EUROPEAN RI LANDSCAPE**

Part 3

In the last 20 years, the European RI landscape has been evolving towards a consolidated ecosystem. Amongst the activities and trends that have been promoting this development are cooperation between RIs - scientific collaborations, partnerships, associations and organizations -, growing interdependence, clustering within scientific domains, interdisciplinarity and interoperability.

We can find examples in:

- Thematic ESFRI clusters established through EU-funded projects to address common issues, exchange experience as well as develop and share good practices related to RI development and operation, and most recently to strengthen their capacity of linking to the European Open Science Cloud
- The Alliance of Medical Research Infrastructures<sup>®</sup> where close collaboration of three ERICs ESFRI Landmarks - EATRIS, ECRIN and BBMRI - with highly complementary methods created significant synergies and new added value, allowing the research community to reach more complex and comprehensive goals, among others on COVID-19.
- Two initiatives of European analytical facilities, the League of Advanced European Neutron Sources<sup>®</sup> and the League of European Accelerator-based Photon Sources<sup>®</sup> are bringing together a critical mass of European analytical facilities in their respective areas to identify synergies and opportunities for closer collaboration, for example around Green Deal, Horizon Europe Missions or COVID-19, as well as develop joint positions on issues of common interest.
- The ENRIITC Consortium<sup>®</sup>, which brings together eleven actors among which the ESFRI Landmarks EMSO ERIC, EATRIS ERIC, ESRF and ESS ERIC, and CLARIN ERIC. This consortium brings together actors from industry and RIs and can have important socioeconomic impacts.


